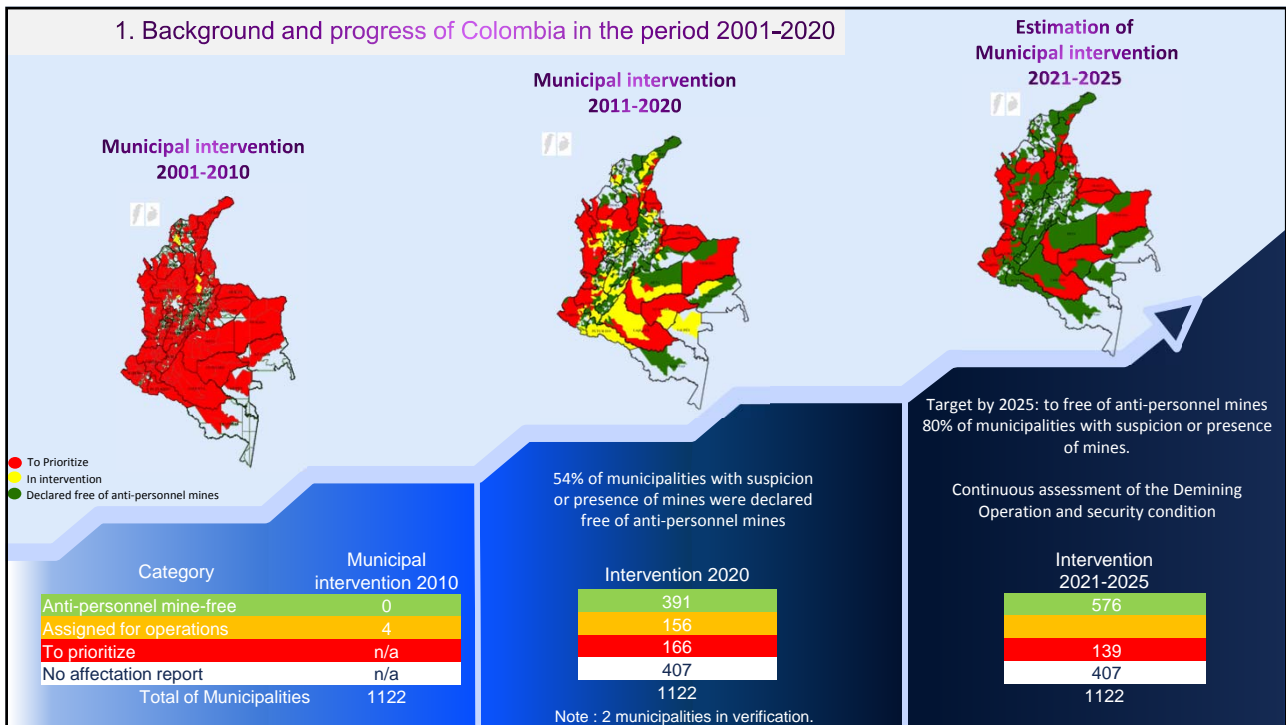

1. Lack of information management
2. Lack of assistance in the follow-up with the Victims.
3. Low capacity for Intervention with Humanitarian Demining Operators.
4. Difficulties in Preventive Actions.
5. Mine victims across the country.
6. From 1990-2010, 78% or 9,228 of victims of the national total were reported.

1. Characterization of municipal affectation
2. Signature of the Peace Agreement between the national government and the FARC-EP.
3. Creation of the Humanitarian Demining Brigade of the National Army and accreditation of demining civil organizations.
4. Creation of coordination and articulation spaces for risk prevention.
5. Creation of routes for assistance and care for victims of anti-personnel mines.
6. From 2011 to May 2020, 22% or 2,588 of the total victims of anti-personnel mines have been reported.

1. Articulation of Mine Action with other policies and state's strategic projects.
2. Humanitarian Demining Operations Sustainment.
3. Update of the municipal risk methodology.
4. Focus and increased coverage for preventive actions.
5. Update National Standards (improve its quality).

Application Period

4 years and 10 months from March 1st, 2021 to December 31st, 2025.

Challenge

- The characteristics of mines with improvised nature.
- Challenges of topographical and climatic conditions.
- Concertation with ethnic communities.
- High perception of risk from communities.
- Financial support needed for the operations.

Cleaning targets for 2025

- 3,334,199 m² of Confirmed Hazardous Areas (APC) identified by ENT in 156 municipalities in intervention (known areas)
- 4,949,100 m² of estimated area in sectors yet to intervene (suspected areas)
- 166 municipalities corresponding to "known unknown" that do not have safety conditions to start operations.

In the course of 2020 there have been 64 casualties for Antipersonnel Mine



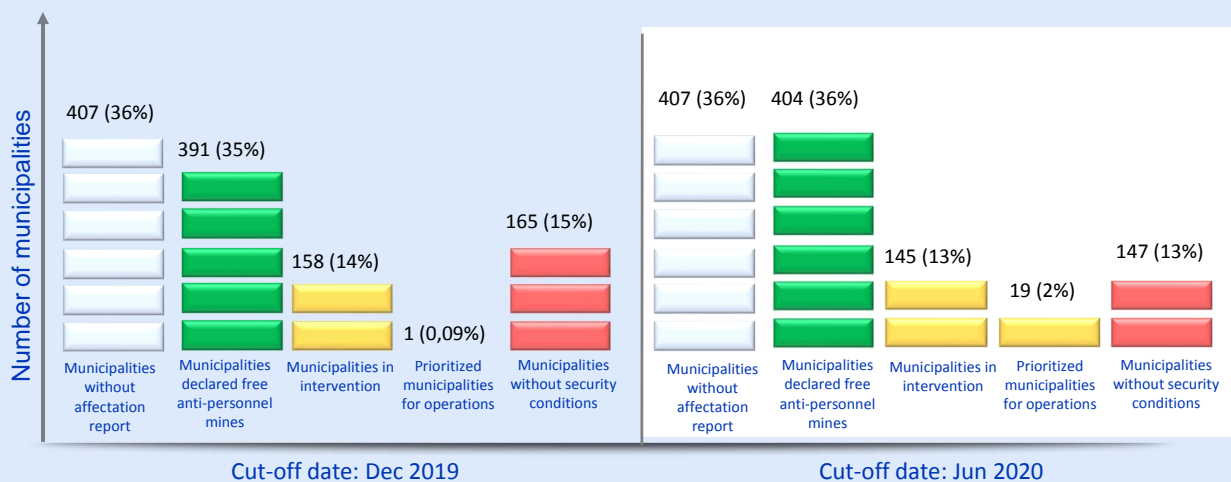
