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Challenges in data collection and centralized databases

Several challenges, including:

- Developing capacities and securing resources to maintain data
- Gathering data when none exists, data is lost, or a database degraded
- Combining multiple databases not in one place or transferable between systems
- Using data that only covers some types of - geographic area; impairment, medical care or rehabilitation; age groups or demographic groups; legal issues; conflict; weapons use; time period etc.
- Creating and implementing a standard methodology and shared terminology
- Compiling enough, but no more detail than necessary for analysis and action
- Involving the meaningful participation of victims and persons with disabilities
- Considering real world issues of gender and diversity, physical barriers, social inequalities, marginalization, and blocked access to data, people, and services
- Making the database relevant to existing services or referral mechanisms
- Providing victim assistance, not only just 'to have a database'
- Ensuring safety, privacy, and statistical disclosure control
- Overcoming institutional risk adversity



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ICBL-CMC Victim Assistance Guiding principles 2021

Data collection and analysis:

- Appropriate for the country's specific situation
- Good data that is easily available to planners and practically relevant
- Casualty and beneficiary data collected, analyzed, and disaggregated by gender, age, and disability
- Inform if victims had an impairment (or disability) prior to the incident
- Careful monitoring to make sure no one is left behind
