- Ensure Treaty compliance: reporting and implementation
- Completion deadline 2028

•Destruction of all stockpiled antipersonnel mines.

•Finished last stockpiled on August 2021

- Act no 03 of 2022 on Prohibition of the Antipersonal Mine was certified on 17 February, 2022 by the parliament
- Sri Lanka has fulfilled the obligations under Art.
 9 of the Convention on national implementation measures.

- 90% of NTS was completed and Started Completion Survey
- All the tasks distributed and predict the completion time line
- Developing of new National mine action strategy workshop on 28




